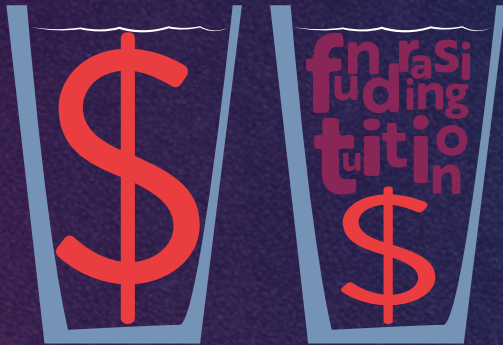

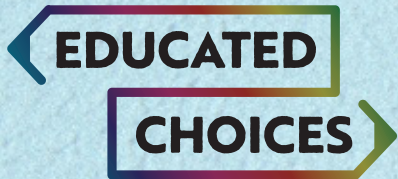

Parents want the best for their children, and that includes choosing a school that best fits their values and beliefs.

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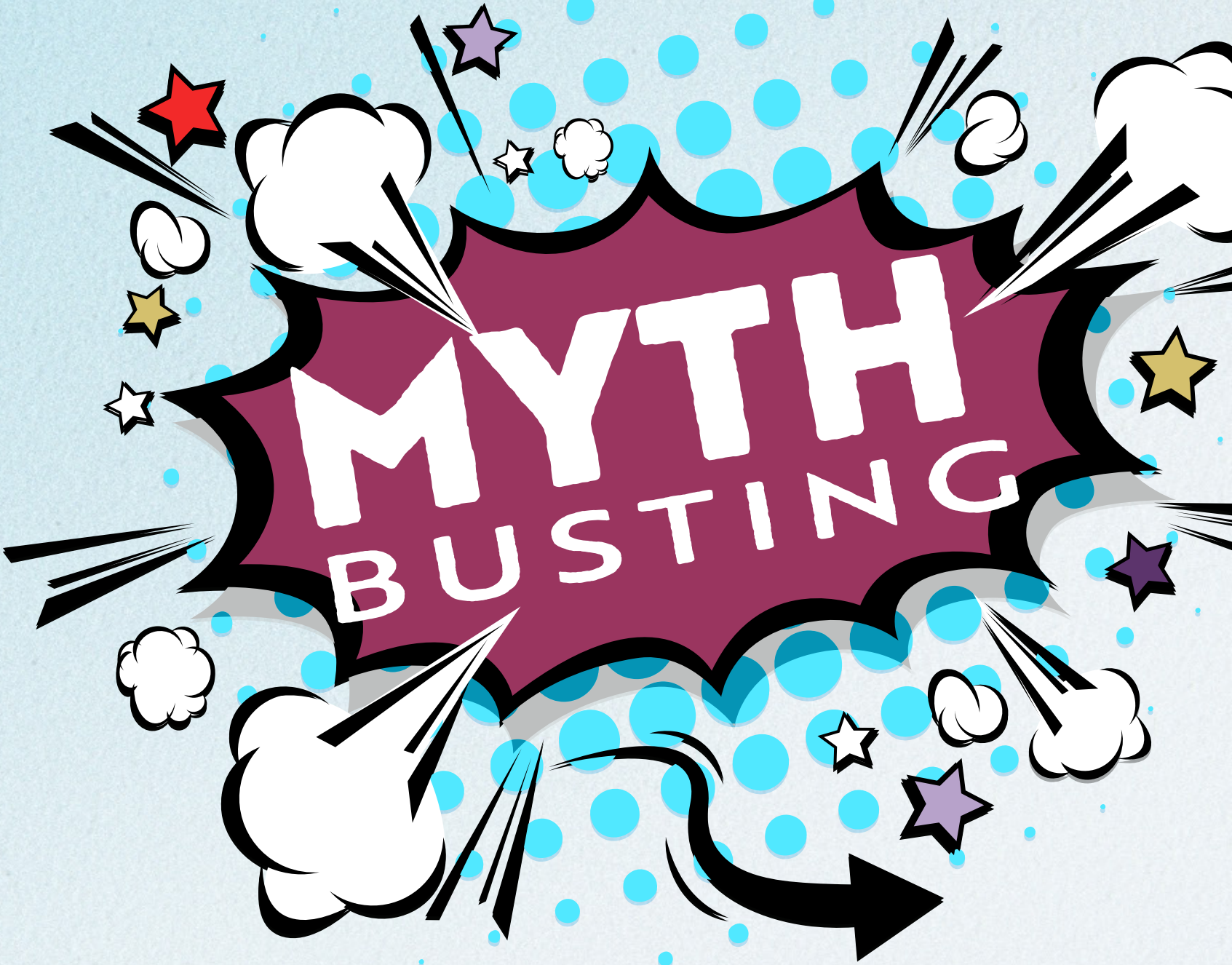


ABOUT AISCA

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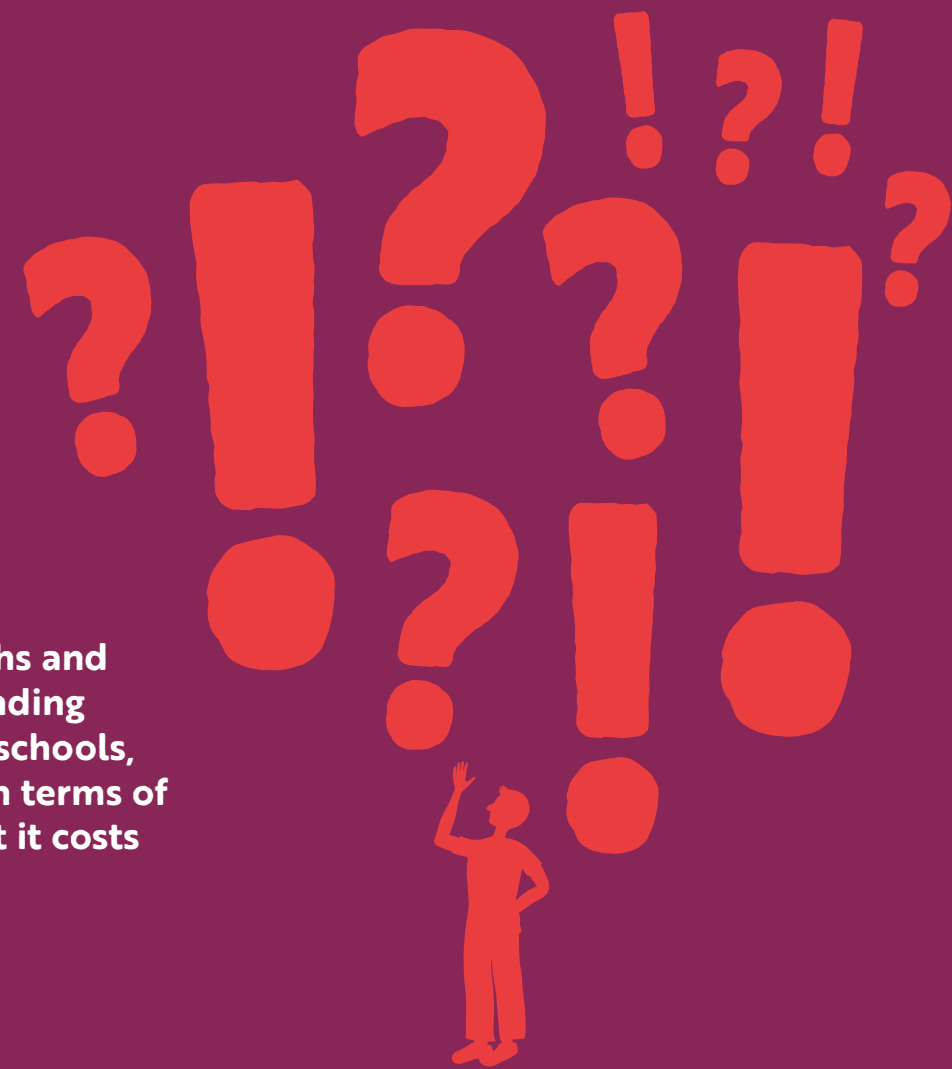

HERE ARE THE FACTS

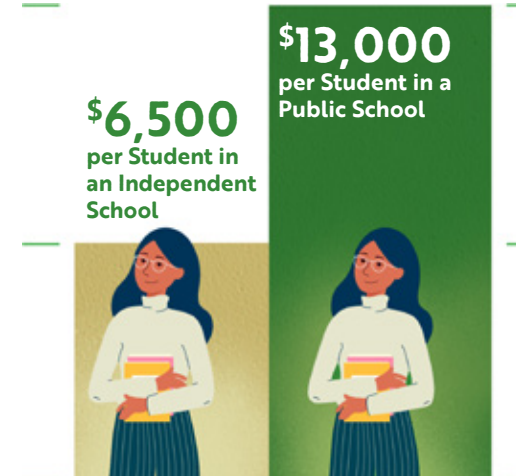
- Independent schools have **existed since before Alberta became a province** in 1905, and are located throughout the province.
- Today, there are over **363** independent schools in Alberta providing a great learning environment for over **53,000** students each year.
- Independent schools that receive public funding are required to operate as **not-for-profit companies or societies**.¹
- Alberta Education requires audits, annual reports and three-year plans; **verification of all teaching credentials**; and on-site monitoring for all independent schools.²
- Alberta's independent schools are dedicated to providing a **well-rounded education** that prepares students not only for academic success, but also for life as **responsible and engaged citizens**.³
- Independent schools create **greater choice for Alberta families**.¹



INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS...

... SAVE TAXPAYERS MONEY

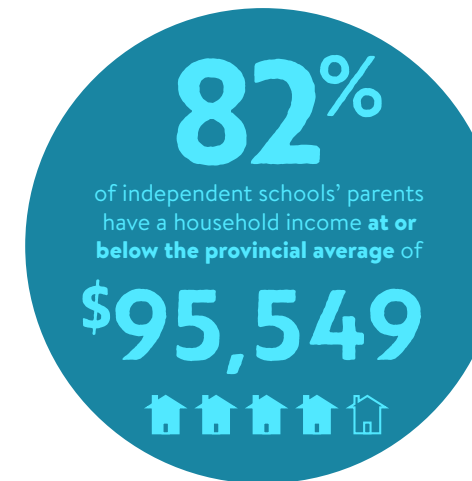
- Independent schools cost taxpayers **significantly less to educate a child**.⁴
- Independent schools have certified teachers delivering the Alberta curriculum to students **at half the cost to taxpayers**.⁵
- Independent schools **receive zero tax dollars** to cover capital costs.⁶
- A significant portion of independent school funding comes from **fundraising and tuitions**.⁷
- Saying independent schools are a burden to taxpayers is not true. **In fact, it's the opposite**.⁴

... CONTRIBUTE TO SOCIETY

- Studies show that students in independent schools often perform well academically and **develop strong social-emotional skills**.⁹
- Sense of Community: Independent schools prioritize building strong partnerships with parents. This fosters a **sense of community** that benefits both students and families.¹⁰
- Parents consider factors beyond test scores, such as a safe environment, cultural fit, and extracurricular activities, when choosing a school.⁹
- Parents report **higher levels of satisfaction with independent schools**.⁸

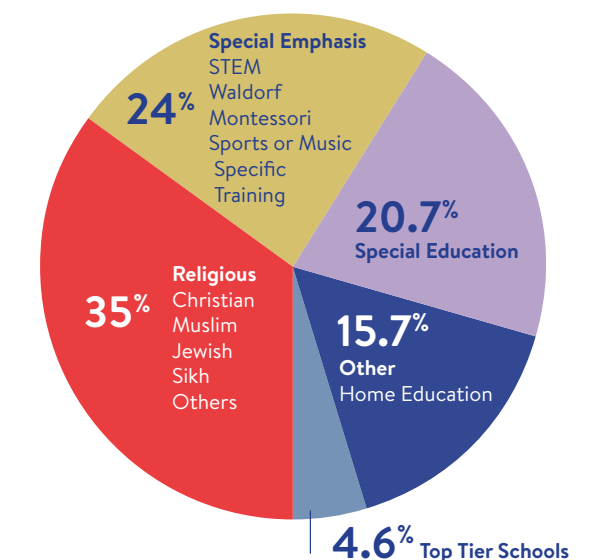


... SERVE KIDS FROM AVERAGE MIDDLE CLASS ALBERTA FAMILIES

- Parents of independent school students come from **all walks of life and financial means**. It is an investment from parents to ensure the right education for their child.⁸
- Having a choice of schooling empowers parents to find the **best fit for their child**, and many parents make **financial sacrifices** such as changing jobs or getting loans.¹
- Current research shows that the **families in over 80% of independent schools have a household income that is slightly below the average household income in Alberta**.⁹
- Some independent schools provide assistance to families through scholarships and financial aid programs.¹⁰
- Tuition plus government funding plus fundraising and partnerships make independent schools work.⁷

... HAVE A HUGE DIVERSITY AMONG THEIR STUDENT POPULATION

- Alberta has over 363 independent schools, catering to specific values and educational focuses, and reflecting the **province's diverse population**.²
- Religious or non-religious independent schools cater to families seeking an education that aligns with their **core values and beliefs**.¹
- Some independent schools focus on **specific teaching methodologies**, which may resonate with parents who want a particular approach to their child's education.⁸
- Independent schools often strive for **academic excellence**, attracting parents who prioritize a rigorous learning environment.⁸
- Certain independent schools specialize in areas like arts, sciences, sports, or vocational training, catering to students with specific interests and talents.⁸
